Comparison of the changes 2021 – 2022

The following list shows content changes within the 2021 Technical Regulations for 2022. Points for which only the texts have been changed for reasons of clarity are not shown.

2.2 Escape Routes (extract)

Hall aisles may not be used as assembly areas or to place machines like woodworking equipment or work benches

Hall aisles must be cleared immediately upon request by Deutsche Messe or its authorized representatives, if required for logistics.

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3.1.3.3 5G

Deutsche Messe operates a 5G campus network in the Frequencies of 3.7 to 3.8 GHz. The operation of infrastructure within this frequency range is reserved exclusively for Deutsche Messe. Access to the 5G campus network of Deutsche Messe can be ordered by the exhibitor for a fee.

The operation of an exhibitor's own 5G network must be coordinated with the TEM before the start of the event.

4.3 Stand heights (extract)

For EuroBLECH: under specific conditions, stands larger than 400 m² may be up to 7.50 m high. Upon request, Deutsche Messe would be pleased to check the feasibility of a particular stand. A fire safety check is mandatory.

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4.8.1 Structures on the open air site (extract)

The erection of tents ≥ 75 m² and other so-called "temporary structures" must be notified in writing at least 14 days prior to the planned acceptance of use, in accordance with § 75 (5) NBauO, in addition to the general approval procedure, in due time, to the following address:

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5.1 Operating safety, technical safety regulations, technical services (extract)

The exhibitor is responsible for safety at his stand and for compliance with industrial safety and accident prevention regulations. The exhibitor is liable for any damage that results from the setup or operation of his stand or the exhibits displayed in it.

The conditions inside and outside the halls, as well as on the open-air site during the setup and dismantling period, are similar to those at a building site. The personnel working in this environment must be made aware of the dangers that exist.

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5.1.1 Damage

Any damage caused to the Exhibition Grounds, its buildings or facilities by exhibitors, organizers or their agents will be repaired by Deutsche Messe at the exhibitor's or organizer's expense following the end of the event.

5.1.2 Coordinating work on the exhibition grounds

If work needs to be carried out simultaneously by workers from different companies at the exhibition stand or event area, (particularly during the setup and dismantling periods), coordination – as regulated by the German Occupational Safety and Health Act (ArbSchG) and Rule No. 1 of DGUV (German Social Accident Insurance) – shall be carried out by the stand construction manager and/or the event manager in the event of potential mutual hazards. This applies in particular to work carried out by Deutsche Messe service partners on the stand and/or event area.

The necessary measures for improving the safety and health protection of employees at the workplace in accordance with the currently valid European Directive EC-RL 89/391/EEC must moreover be observed and implemented during work on the Exhibition Grounds.

5.12 Playing music

The playing/performing of live or recorded music must be registered with GEMA – a German society representing copy-right holders, and is subject to a fee. Exhibitors can register online via the event specific shop.

Failure to inform GEMA can result in fines being levied pursuant to §97 of the Copyright Law.

5.12 Playing music

Musical renditions of any kind require the consent of the Society for Musical Performing and Mechanical Reproduction Rights (GEMA) in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions (Copyright Act).

Unregistered musical renditions may result in claims for damages by GEMA (section 97 of the German Copyright Act).

6.1.1 Disposal (extract)

Kindly adhere to the following principles of recycling management at the exhibition grounds.

The emphasis is on avoiding waste at exhibition sites. Exhibitors and their contract partners shall cooperate and support this goal at all stages of the event, beginning with the planning stage. For setup and operation

6.1.1 Disposal (extract)

In accordance with the Closed Substance Cycle Waste Management Act, the Commercial Waste Ordinance (GewAbfV) and the Waste Framework Directive (Directive 2008/98/EC as amended by Directive (EU) 2018/851), the generation of waste should be avoided as a primary objective during the setup, operation and dismantling periods at trade fair venues.

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of a stand, exhibitors should use only recyclable materials and/or materials that are not harmful to the environment.

Exhibitors and their contractual partners are obliged to con-tribute to this goal at every stage of the event – a goal which must be pursued as early as the planning stage and in cooperation with all parties involved. As a general rule, reusable and environmentally friendly materials should be used to the greatest possible extent for stand construction and operation.
